

# Final Project

## Portfolio Website

Your final project should demonstrate your understanding of web design from what we've learned through past assignments. Both form and function must be considered while laying out the wireframes and code for your site.

This site will be a personal portfolio that reflects your personal interests or a body of your artwork. Your website should be representative of your web development capabilities – the fundamentals taught in this course will be used as the base to grade your project. You will also be scored on your website's implementation, such as its organization and ease of use.

Your project should be original and unique. DO NOT use any previous layouts that have already been created in this course.

This is not an opportunity for you to just "breeze" through the next few weeks. It's also not about a quick fix and "I'm done" project nor is it a take home test. It's about form and design. The lab time is your time. A time to think, struggle, experiment, create, and use the skills that you've learned so far and put them to use. If your final project is just a pure fun project without purpose your grade will reflect that purpose.

## Final Project Criteria

1. Minimum Required Pages
  1. Home Page
  2. About Page
  3. Portfolio Page ( have at least 6 examples of your work )
  4. Contact Page
  5. Inspiration Page ( a dedicated page to resources and portfolios of your choice )

## 2. Design

1. Consistent design throughout the site.
2. Easy to navigate and clean layout.
3. Each page must have a different layout. The header and footer elements may be reused throughout the site.

## 3. Navigation

1. Nav needs to be consistent in terms of appearance, links, and location.
2. It's clearly labeled and easy to understand

## 4. Content

1. Be sure to label your html files accordingly to the relative content on the page.
2. Each page must have at least two paragraphs of relevant information.
3. There must be at least two links located somewhere in the site that directs to a page located outside the site. Social networking links don't count as your two links.
4. Have at least one page coded using fixed widths.
5. Have at least one page coded using fluid widths.
6. Using at least two different fonts from Google Fonts.
7. Have at least 3 images per page.
8. Be sure your images are in an appropriate web format.
9. Remember to keep all your CSS code for all your pages in one document.
10. Please include a wireframe and static mockups of your site.
